Engineer's Report 9.1. The Director of Operations provided an overview of Engineering and the distribution of schemes for the Boards. 9.2. Parrett Operations & Maintenance: Length of viewed rhyne maintained: 580 km open channel, 6.7 km culverted watercourse. Water level management: 367 Water level control structures, operated by Expeditors/private landowners. 1 Pumping Station. Podimore. Other operational challenges or improvements in the preceding year: Thorney combe to Thorney Lake area made safer with a more workable bank put in place. Sections of Back Brook and Dry Brook (Cary Valley). Hinton Meads Brook (1,914m) removed Section of Back Stream Upper added to Back Stream Lower from A303. Marston Magna Rhyne extended west from Park Farm to Weir. An additional siphon (LG076) has been added at Summerway Bridge Rhyne Cannington Brook (EA main river) no longer IDB maintained (2089m). 242 highways culverts, bridges and structures inspected and risk assessed.(As of Jan 2020) Flood and Drought Management

- 9.3. Axe Brue Operations and Maintenance:
 - Length of viewed rhyne maintained: 614 km open channel, 9 km culverted watercourse.
 - Length of IDB desilting: 9.7 km. Due to the delayed start not all desilting was completed and some work had to be postponed until Nov/Dec 2020.
 - Water level management: Total of 332 assets, of which 214 are water level control structures operated by IDB staff and Board Members/Private Landowners under IDB supervision.
 - Other operational challenges or improvements in the preceding year: During the 2019 summer the UK recorded its highest ever temperature 38.7C (101.6F) on Thursday 25th July at Cambridge Botanic Garden. High temperatures were also recorded within the Board's area and this presented some challenges with water supply within the rhyne systems however the Agency and the IDBs monitored the situation and worked together successfully to overcome water supply issues.
 - In contrast to the summer, the winter of 2019/20 was one of the wettest on record which saw the Wessex region received an 'exceptionally high' amount of rainfall in February of 147mm (223% LTA). This was once again dealt with by the operational team working with the EA.
